Nursing

Nursing is a unique and independent discipline, which is constantly evolving to address the needs of society. According to the World Health Organization, 6 million new nurses are needed by 2030 only in low and middle-income countries. Nursing education of the 21st century ought to reflect contemporary advances in healthcare and prepare nurses to provide holistic and compassionate care across all spheres.

The AUA Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN):

- Is a bridging program for nurses who have a diploma in nursing or midwifery and seek to advance into higher education.
- Requires the completion of 75 credits at AUA and typically takes up to 3 years.
- Graduates nurses who function independently and competently by using evidence-based practice, health informatics and technology, and strengthening the academic-practice partnerships for career-long learning.

Admission Requirements

- AUA Application for Admission to BSN program with all required supplements
- A proof of graduation and transcript from a nursing college with good academic performance
- A proof of English language proficiency:
 - TOEFL Internet Based Test (iBT) or Academic IELTS
 - Alternative internal English proficiency testing
 - English Language Proficiency Test Waiver
- An interview

Financial Assistance

Citizens of Armenia and Armenian Special Passport Holders will receive an automatic subsidy of **95%** of tuition.

International students are eligible for merit-based scholarships that may cover up to **50%** of the total cost of tuition.

What to expect

The program prepares nurses to promote health and deliver nursing care to diverse patient populations across the lifespan and across the four spheres of care: (1) disease prevention and health promotion, (2) chronic disease care, (3) regenerative or restorative care, and (4) palliative or supportive care. AUA prepares nurses who are not only well-grounded but also well-rounded individuals, who are able to think critically and creatively, to learn on their own, to understand different kinds of thinking, to work in teams, and to deal with people from different cultures and disciplines. The program provides rich and varied opportunities for practice experiences that focus on person-centered care of the individual, family, and community.

General Education

The BSN degree consists of two components including Nursing Major requirements and General Education requirements. While the Major courses provide students with depth, specialization, and career preparation, General Education gives breadth and a foundation of general knowledge, perspectives, and skills for life. Both are carefully designed components to assure that graduates are ready for lifelong learning, whether in the classroom, in their profession, or on their own.
